Course

Description

Learn about Canada and the wider global community by exploring history, culture, diversity, sustainability, community engagement and intercultural communication. Build your communication confidence by studying with other international students and interacting with Canadians outside of the classroom. Our globally-minded students start here to begin their development of the knowledge, skills and attitudes critical to their future academic and professional success.

This course consists of 19 Communication Skills for Global Citizenship classes held on Monday to Friday from 0830 to 1230. Learn Canadian culture through a variety of afternoon activities both indoor and outdoor in and around the capital city of Edmonton, Alberta.



Costs

Course Fee CAD \$2,150.00 per student

The course fee is in Canadian dollars and includes tuition, placement test and all scheduled activities. It does not include, airfare, city transit pass, airport transportation, accommodation fees, personal expenses or medical or travel insurance.

Homestay

Canada Homestay Network (CHN) includes a meal plan. Prices vary based on arrival and departure dates, number of participants, and dietary preferences. Space is limited and applications must be submitted directly to CHN for final quote and payment.
