### 1. 留学期間

2026年8月28日（金）～9月27日（日）

※授業期間：8月31日（月）～9月25日（金）



### 2. 留学先・プログラム名称

カナダ・アルバータ大学附属語学学校・ESLプログラム

アルバータ大学は、州都エドモントンに位置する州立総合大学で、国内では常に上位5校に数えられるカナダ有数の名門大学です。2017年に岐阜大学と協定を締結しています。

### 3. 募集定員

20名 ※応募者が20名を超える場合は、留学を希望する理由などを参考に選考を行います。

選考の有無にかかわらず、参加決定通知を5月中旬頃に送付します。

### 4. 内容

午前：英語研修（Communication Skills for Global Citizenship）月～金 8:30～12:30

留学開始前にオンラインでの語学能力テストを実施し、その結果に応じて適切なレベルのクラスに振り分けられます。（1クラス20名程度）カナダの文化や歴史などのトピックを通じて、少人数のグループに分かれて行うディスカッションや、プレゼンをする授業が中心です。

午後：様々なアクティビティ

現地の方と交流ができる「Conversation Club」、大学内の施設見学、エドモントン周辺の観光など。

【オプションツアー】

週末に実施されるオプションツアーは、プログラム費用とは別に、ツアー参加費を支払うことで参加できます。

3種類のツアーが予定されており、費用および行程の詳細は別紙を参照ください。

### 5. 現地での滞在

約1カ月の留学期間は全てホームステイとなり、1日3食が提供されます。食事のアレルギーや持病への配慮も可能ですが、追加で費用がかかる場合があります。また夏の期間は繁忙期となるため、1家庭に複数名の参加者（他の留学生や岐阜大学の学生）と同居する場合があります。

## 6. 単位認定

研修終了後、全学共通教育科目「英語 1～4」のいずれかとして 2 単位を認定することができます。  
なお単位認定の手続きには、研修終了後にアルバータ大学が発行する修了証が必要となります。

- ・留学プログラムの参加に係る諸手続きや航空券の予約は留学支援係にて手続きいたします。
- ・渡航 1 か月前に、持ち物や空港での手続きに関する案内をまとめた「旅のしおり」をお渡しします。
- ・渡航前の 7～8 月に英語での事前研修を予定しています。前年度は現地での生活に関わる基礎知識（現地の通貨、交通機関の利用方法、ホームステイ等）をテーマとした全 4 回の研修を実施しました。  
開催時期は現在調整中で参加は任意ですが、留学準備として有益な内容であるため是非参加ください。
- ・申し込み後に参加を辞退する場合は 4/30（木）正午までに留学支援係へご連絡ください。それ以降の参加辞退は、旅行会社の規定に基づき、航空券のキャンセル料が発生する場合がございます。

**Description**

Learn about Canada and the wider global community by exploring history, culture, diversity, sustainability, community engagement and intercultural communication. Build your communication confidence by studying with other international students and interacting with Canadians outside of the classroom. Our globally-minded students start here to begin their development of the knowledge, skills and attitudes critical to their future academic and professional success.

This course consists of four weeks of Communication Skills for Global Citizenship classes held daily from Monday to Friday. Learn Canadian culture through a variety of afternoon activities both indoor and outdoor in and around the capital city of Edmonton, Alberta.

<b>March Term</b>	February 24 to March 20, 2026
<b>July Term</b>	July 2 to July 28, 2026
<b>August Term</b>	August 4 to August 28, 2026
<b>September Term</b>	August 31 to September 25, 2026

Closed cohorts are possible with a minimum of 12 participants from January to July. Pending approval from the English Language School.

**Registration Deadline**

Completed name list must be received no later than three months prior to the start of the term.

**Payment Deadline**

Payment by invoice is required one week prior to the start of the term.


**Costs**

**Course Fee** CAD \$2,150.00 per student

The course fee is in Canadian dollars and includes tuition, placement test and all scheduled activities. It does not include, airfare, city transit pass, airport transportation, accommodation fees, personal expenses or medical or travel insurance.

**Homestay**

Canada Homestay Network (CHN) includes a meal plan. Prices vary based on arrival and departure dates, number of participants, and dietary preferences. Space is limited and applications must be submitted directly to CHN for final quote and payment.
