The 32nd Gifu University Summer School Program (2019)

The 2019 four-week Summer School started on June 26. Ten students came to Gifu University from our partner universities in four different countries. They are; three from Northern Kentucky University (U.S.), two from Mokpo National University (South Korea), two from Guangxi University (China), one from University of Electronic Science and Technology of China (also China), and two from the National University of Malaysia (UKM, Malaysia).

June 26, Orientation/Opening Ceremony/Campus Tour/Welcome Party

In the afternoon of June 26, students took part in orientation and campus tour. They also attended the school's opening ceremony in the evening. At the welcome party, students enjoyed conversations with GU student monitors and international students already studying at the University.





June 27, Start of Japanese Language Classes

June 28, Bird Watching Workshop & Japanese Haiku Composition





Students enjoyed a bird watching tour held at Nagaragawa Fureai-no-Mori park (Gifu City) where they enjoyed a firsthand view of the local ecosystem. This was followed by a workshop where the students introduced the nature and birds indigenous to their home countries and composed Japanese haiku poems in response to the birdwatching experience.

July 4, University Hospital Tour & Medical English Workshop with Nursing Students

After a tour of the University Hospital, students joined the Medical English Workshop with the third-year nursing students.





July 5, Excursion to Seki City: Edged Tool Workshop





Students took part in traditional sword making demonstration at Seki Hamono Museum (Seki City, Gifu) and later joined a scissormaking workshop. The students were then invited by the local volunteers to try on traditional Japanese kimonos as an added Japanese cultural experience.

July 10, Nohgaku (Noh & Kyogen) Workshop

Nohgaku (Noh & Kyogen traditional performing arts) workshop was held on campus. Students first listened to lectures on Noh given by Mr. Mikata and Mr. Tamoi (main actors called "Shite" in Kanze School) and explanations on Kyogen given by Kyogen drama performers. Students then viewed a Nohgaku stage performance by professional actors.





July 12-15, Gujo Homestay Program

With the support from Gujo City and Gujo Hachiman International Friendship Association, students participated in a number of local cultural events and homestay program.

July 12: Visited Hachiman Elementary School, dressed up in yukata (summer kimono), practiced Gujo bon dancing, experienced kendo training with Gujo Senior High School Kendo Club, attended a welcome party and stayed with their host family.
