# **Special Commemorative Ceremony Honoring** the President of the Republic of Lithuania

ifu University had the honor of conferring an Honorary Doctorate to the President of the Republic of Lithuania, Dr. Gitanas Nauseda during his visit to Gifu University. The president was visiting Japan for the enthronement ceremony to celebrate His Majesty the Emperor's accession to the throne. During his stay, he visited Gifu Prefecture because of the strong historical/cultural ties

between Lithuania and Gifu Prefecture. In his memorial lecture, "Lithuania and Japan: The way forward," the President spoke about the history of exchange, culture, economy and the future between Lithuania and Japan. He concluded his speech by expressing his strong wishes for an enduring, solid partnership between the two countries.

U-GLOCAL hosted "Gifu Joint Degree Symposium 2019" at Nagaragawa Convention Center (Gifu City) in commemoration of the launching of four Joint Degree (JD) Master's and Doctoral programs with our counterpart overseas research institutions, Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (IITG) and the National University of Malaysia (UKM).

At the opening of the symposium, Gifu University President Moriwaki and invited dignitaries which included Dr. Sitharam (Director of IITG), Dr. Shukor (Vice-Chancellor of UKM), Mr. Muivah (Secretary of North East Council of Indian Government), and Dr. Biswas (former director of

IITG) greeted the audience of approx. 220 people. Their greetings were followed by a keynote speech by Mr. Kuniaki Sato from MEXT. Convening academic sessions focused on discussions on sustainable developments. Panel discussions were also presided on the theme of three-way collaboration among Japanese, Indian and Malaysian industry-government-academia. Video messages from the Federation of Industry & Commerce of North Eastern Region (FINER), and from the first batch of JD students at IITG and UKM were aired publicly. The symposium resulted in establishing a significant milestone toward a successful implementation of the JD programs in the years to come.
