### President of Gifu University visits UIR, Kingdom of Morocco

December 16-18

rom December 16 to 18, a Gifu University delegation visited Université Internationale de Rabat (UIR), Kingdom of Morocco. The delegation members included President YOSHIDA Kazuhiro, Vice President KAMBARA Shinji, Director YOSHINO Jun (Applied Meteorological Research Center), and Manager KOBAYASHI Keiko (International Engagement Division). They met UIR President Dr. Noureddine MOUADDIB and other board members of UIR and also explored the capital city of Morocco, Rabat and others. This visit was realized thanks to the kind proposal of exchange between the two universities by H.E. Mr. Rachad BOUHLAL, Ambassador of the Kingdom of Morocco to Japan when he visited Gifu University on May 2.

At the meeting with Dr. Noureddine MOUADDIB, 18 people, including the vice president and the deans of UIR, discussed the possibility of academic and student exchange and joint research projects in energy engineering. Both the GU delegation and UIR, board members agreed to proceed with the preparation for concluding a university-level exchange agreement in the future.

Gifu Prefecture and the Kingdom of Morocco have a long history of friendship, and GU delegation's latest visit to UIR is expected to result in a student and researcher exchange agreement and further accelerate the bilateral ties between Gifu Prefecture and the Kingdom of Morocco.









## GU President attends '2nd Japan-India Universities Forum' and 'STS Forum 20th Annual Meeting 2023' | September 30 and October

resident YOSHIDA Kazuhiro and Professor KOYAMA Hiroyuki (Executive Director of GU-GLOCAL) attended the two international conferences held in Kyoto: "The 2nd Japan-India Universities Forum" on September 30, and "STS1 Forum 20th Annual Meeting 2023" on October 1.

The theme of the forum on September 30 was "Promotion of brain circulation between Japan and India," and the participants shared their thoughts on how to materialize the declaration on human resource development and education adopted in the first Japan-India Universities Forum.

The first session of the forum began with the keynote speeches on the themes of 'promotion of studying abroad,' 'cooperation in human resource development,' and 'industry and academia collaboration.' This was followed by informal talks where the participants exchanged opinions on the two themes; 'development of an infrastructure to increase the number of Indian students and researchers in Japan,' and 'industry-academia collaboration for human global mobility.'

In the second session, the participants were divided into small groups to discuss the specifics of partnership and exchange between Japanese and Indian universities. Gifu University representatives held talks with their counterparts from the Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (IITG, India) and the Indian Institute of Technology Hyderabad. They spent time discussing how to reinforce their university partnership in the years to come. At the end of the talks, they agreed to hammer out the details of cooperation when President Yoshida visits India in March 2024. The talks turned out to be very productive and instrumental in forging a closer tie among the three universities.

The major objective of the 'STS Forum 20th Annual Meeting 2023' was to offer a venue for experts at home and abroad to address global agendas such as climate change. President Yoshida attended the 'University President Meeting' session, where presidents of 77 universities around the world engaged in discussions under the title of 'Future Created by Humankind and Artificial intelligence (AI).' They exchanged opinions about the use of AI in science and technology, how to deal with ethical problems arising from AI, and the benefits of AI through its application to education, including adult education.

October 30

n October 30, Dr. François Le Roy, Executive Director of the Center for Global Issues and International Affairs, Northern Kentucky University (NKU, the United States of America) visited Gifu University. GU and NKU signed an exchange agreement in October 1990. Since then, active exchanges have continued among faculty and students between the two universities. Dr. Le Roy held a meeting with President YOSHIDA Kazuhiro and GU board members, including Vice President KAMBARA Shinji, GU-GLOCAL Executive Director KOYAMA Hiroyuki, GU-GLOCAL Associate Director SHIMA Mutsuhiro, Professor TATSUMI Toru (Faculty of Education, GU liaison for NKU), and Ms. NONOMURA Haruko, Director of the Student Affairs Department.

In the meeting, Dr. Le Roy and the GU board members talked about the long history of exchange and the future interaction between GU and NKU, as well as the possibilities of building a partnership between Gifu and Gifu's wider region, Tokai, and the Greater Cincinnati Area<sup>1</sup>, including NKU, by exploring similarities between the two regions.

### The 5th Gifu Joint Degree Symposium 2023

he 5th Gifu Joint Degree Symposium 2023' was held online and in-person from November 16 to December 8. The Symposium consisted of following three sessions: the 'THERS JDP' Symposium,' the 'Academic Session,' and the 'Industry-Government-Academia-Banking Institution Collaboration Session.'

In the 'Academic Session' held on November 16 and 17 with the theme, 'Sustainable Development of Regions; SDGs² and beyond,' ten speakers from IITG, the National Institute of Technology Surathkal, Karnataka (India), Kyoto University, Hokkaido University, Nagoya University, delivered speeches on their research themes.

The 'THERS JDP Symposium' held on December 7 with the theme, 'Joint Degree Programs for the Development of Human Resources Capable of Addressing Global Agendas: Aiming for Internationalization in Education and Research, and Revitalization of Community, started with the keynote speech by Mr. KOBAYASHI Yosuke, Counselor from the Higher Education Bureau, MEXT.3 In the subsequent panel discussion, Mr. Kobayashi joined in discussions with the representatives from the three universities and exchanged opinions regarding enrollment of JDP students and the future of JDP students' business and academic careers.

On December 8, the 'Industry-Government-Academia-Banking Institution Collaboration Session' was held in the University Auditorium (and it was also streamed live online). Since the session was conducted as the 'Gifu University Symposium' as well, various activities of GU-GLOCAL were highlighted for the audience. In the panel discussion, guest speakers and GU professors engaged in intensive discussions focusing on the themes, 'Glocal Commitment to a Decarbonized Society,' and 'Application of Indian Bamboo Resources to Businesses.' On the same day, a total of 25 companies from the Tokai Region showcased their products and services to international and Japanese students who visited their exhibition booths set up at the Faculty of Engineering building.

A total of 295 people attended the '5th Gifu Joint Degree Symposium 2023' from Japan and abroad (75 people attended the 'THERS JDP Symposium,' 92 attended the 'Academic Session,' and 128 attended the 'Industry-Government-Academia-Banking Institution Collaboration Session'). Gifu University continues to host JDP related events to further promote internationalization of the university and the community.

Additionally, students who had studied abroad through the 'Valor V Drug Overseas Training Scholarship,' 'Tobitate! Study Abroad JAPAN (by MEXT),' and short-term study abroad programs from various faculties gave presentations.

Participants eagerly listened to explanations from each presenter and engaged in individual questions after the fair, demonstrating their high level of interest in studying abroad.

U-GLOCAL hosted a short-term inbound program called the 'Winter School Program 2023' from December 6 through December 22. This year marked the seventh program since its launch. Gifu University accepted six students from IITG and two students from the National University of Malaysia (UKM, Malaysia) this year. IITG and UKM are GU's two overseas partner universities in implementing the Joint Degree Programs (JDP) for students, which started in 2019.



The theme of the 'Winter School Program 2023' was "Studying the science of Japanese traditions." The participating students were given an opportunity to visit Japanese companies, interact with Japanese students, engage in research activities, and experience Japanese culture, during the two-week-long program.

The students also took part in the 'Gifu-JDP Symposium' held on December 8. Additionally, they enjoyed an informal meeting with GU students and Gifu City senior high school students, analyzed ceramics and potteries with a special device, and carried out experiments on some Japanese food and cooking methods.



Throughout the entire workshop, participating international students expressed positive feedback, stating that it was a valuable opportunity to understand each other's perspectives on the employment of highly skilled talent and to identify their own challenges. Company representatives also shared their comments such as "We would like to continue to discuss internally the purposes and challenges of employing foreign workers before



participating in the workshop again next year," They also expressed their appreciation for the opportunities to gain insights into students Japanese language proficiency and the support needed for foreign employees.

Moving forward, we will continue to enhance communication between international students and the business community and provide strong support for international students' endeavors to pursue their employment opportunities in Japan.



### **International Month 2023: Special Symposium**

October 31

n October 31, a renowned neuroscientist, Dr. MOGI Kenichiro, and a successful corporate management executive, Mr. SHIONO Makoto, were invited to hold discussions with President YOSHIDA Kazuhiro of Gifu University at the 'Special Symposium of the International Month 2023.' The theme of the symposium was 'Where does globalization take us? We need to survive the threat from Chat-GPT. Is it English skills that help us to adapt to internationalization?'



The symposium was held at the university auditorium and was attended by approximately 280 people both from onand off-campus. The symposium was also livestreamed through GU's 'Glocal Lesson' platform. An estimated 100 people viewed the discussions among three speakers in real time for about 90 minutes.

Assistant Professor MATSUI Mayumi (GU-GLOCAL) moderated the discussions, which started with a question from a student, "Is studying abroad an advantage in finding a job?" The discussions continued with many questions from the audience, such as "Why do we still need to study English or study abroad in this day and age when people can use generative AI for English translation?"

Mr. Shiono quoted his own investment experiences and the success of his business in Finland, where English is not an official language. He said, "Closing deals in English is a perquisite in this globalization era." He then explained how English is used as the common language by millions of people around the world. Dr. Mogi touched on some strong English accents used by many world business leaders, and he reiterated that speaking 'flawless, perfect' English is not always very important.

When President Yoshida introduced the Joint Degree Programs (JDP) conducted with IITG, and UKM, Dr. Mogi said, "Going to foreign countries blessed with rich diversity and studying at one of the best universities in the world gives you an enormous advantage in the future."

"As a corporate manager, if I find JDP diploma in a potential hire's entry sheet for job application, I will become excited to see him or her in person. I know that these applicants are quite different from others," said Mr. Shiono.

The three also spoke of generative AI, which is making exponential progress these days. When Mr. Shiono said, "Thinking about AI is thinking about humans," Dr. Mogi stood up and yelled to the audience, "Let's be more aggressive in absorbing knowledge!" Heated discussions among the speakers continued throughout the symposium.

At the end of the symposium, the three speakers gave their thoughts about the skills that are needed to work for the international community in the future. The symposium wrapped up with strong words of encouragement and wishes for the success of GU students.

GU is currently carrying out JDP at the Graduate School of Natural Science and Technology (master's), the Graduate School of Engineering (PhD), and the United Graduate School of Agricultural Science (PhD). We look forward to welcoming your application for JDP!
